Pre-driving vehicle checks	Failure to ensure vehicle is roadworthy may lead to vehicle collisions	<ul> <li>All exterior lights to be checked</li> <li>Engine oil and water levels to be checked, including anti-freeze levels</li> <li>Water levels in washer bottles to be checked</li> <li>Tyres to be checked for condition and pressure</li> <li>All windows and mirrors to be cleaned</li> <li>Fuel level to be checked</li> </ul>
Driving in any adverse weather conditions	Adverse weather can increase likelihood of vehicle collisions	<ul> <li>Local and national weather forecasts to be checked before setting off</li> <li>If severe weather is forecast, journey should be delayed or cancelled</li> <li>If possible and safe to do so, walk or use public transport rather than driving</li> </ul>
Driving in heavy rain	Poor visibility and increased stopping distances may lead to vehicle collisions	<ul> <li>Windscreen wipers to be kept in good condition</li> <li>Vehicle speed to be reduced, with at least a four-second gap from the vehicle in front</li> <li>Lights to be used if visibility is poor</li> <li>Screen heater to be used to prevent misting</li> </ul>
Driving in fog	Poor visibility may lead to vehicle collisions	<ul> <li>Vehicle speed to be reduced, keeping a longer gap from the vehicle in front</li> <li>Fog lights (where fitted) to be used</li> <li>Vehicle to be driven using dipped headlights</li> <li>If visibility becomes very poor, driver to pull over in a safe place until it improves</li> </ul>
Driving in ice or snow	Icy road conditions may lead to driver losing control of the vehicle	<ul> <li>Vehicle speed to be reduced, with at least a 10-second gap from the vehicle in front</li> <li>Drivers to drive steadily and keep to salted/gritted roadways</li> <li>Drivers to maintain a safe distance behind salting vehicles or snow ploughs</li> <li>Drivers to take corners slowly and in the highest gear possible to avoid skidding</li> <li>Drivers to use dipped headlights when driving in snow</li> <li>Drivers to ensure windows and mirrors are kept free from ice/snow</li> </ul>
Driving in high winds	High winds may lead to driver losing control of the vehicle.	<ul> <li>Vehicle speed to be reduced, maintaining a steady course</li> <li>Drivers to keep a safe distance from other vehicles</li> <li>Drivers to avoid overtaking, especially high-sided vehicles and very small vehicles</li> </ul>

Breakdown preparation	Failure to prepare for breakdowns may put driver at risk.	<ul> <li>Vehicle to carry a warning triangle to be used in the event of a breakdown</li> <li>Vehicle to carry tools for changing a wheel</li> <li>Driver to have a torch for use in the dark</li> <li>For long journeys vehicles to be equipped with a spare fuel can</li> <li>Driver to carry emergency telephone numbers in the event of a breakdown</li> <li>Driver to always carry emergency kit including ice-scraper and de-icer, blanket, warm coat and boots, food and drink, first-aid kit, map, old carpet and snow shovel,</li> </ul>
